

Key question to be answered:

How well do Year 6 disadvantaged children perform compared to their non-disadvantaged peers at Reaside and nationally?

Context

213 children were on roll at end of the Summer Term 2024. 70% of children were Pupil Premium

45 out of 52* children (87%) of Year 6 in 2023/24 were disadvantaged.

One child was not included in our EOY data due to not sitting the KS2 SATs (J coded).
