

Reaside Academy – Pupil Premium Impact Report

2024-2025

Key question to be answered:

How well do Year 6 disadvantaged children perform compared to their non-disadvantaged peers at Reaside and nationally?

Context

207 children were on roll at end of the Summer Term 2025. 74% of children were Pupil Premium

42 out of 49 children (87%) of Year 6 in 2024/25 were disadvantaged.
